Don't buy a bike too tall.


I wouldn't want you to fall.

Be sure it has a strong buckle and strap




Practice steering as straight as an arrow At your school playground where the lines are narrow. Follow the lines 'til you wobble no more, Then riding straight won't be such a chore.

If less than 14 inches are your wheels


No matter how big your bike feels.

To be facing traffic is wrong totally.


Stay close to the edge of the road if you can,


And keep your eye on all cars, trucks and vans.

It's a place to be careful and move cautiously.


The playground is where you can go to and play.

Please pay attention to all the road signs.


They come in many colors, shapes and kinds.

Ride on the right side, do not face traffic.


Check your bike often for loose parts.
